Description: Bonneville Power Administration (Bonneville) is the sole federal power marketing agency in the Northwest and the region's major wholesaler of electricity. Created by Congress in 1937, Bonneville services the states of Washington, Oregon, Idaho, and Montana west of the Continental Divide, and small adjacent portions of California, Montana, Nevada, Utah and Wyoming. Bonneville markets and transmits power, coordinates operation of the Federal Columbia River Power System, and manages a large portion of the Pacific Northwest-Pacific Southwest intertie. Although it lacks authority to build or own dams or power plants, Bonneville does own and operate, within its service area, the nation's largest network of long-distance, high-voltage transmission lines. Although part of the U.S. Department of Energy, Bonneville is not funded by tax revenues; the agency recovers the cost of operations and maintenance mainly through its electricity rates.
